1) Reflection for the 32<sup>nd</sup>
Sunday in Ordinary Time: We devote the month of November in remembrance and hope. While



we grieve those who died, especially the many lives lost to the pandemic, at the same time, the word of God calls us to be a people of hope. Divine wisdom calls us to be alert and ready, as exemplified by the wise bridesmaids!

- 2) November is the month of remembrance. We begin with the Solemnity of All Saints on November 1 (Sunday), followed by the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). Prayer in communion with the saints and for the deceased, are part of our practice. The remembrance of the deceased by a Mass intention is a long tradition in our Church. During this month, because of COVID, parishioners can call the office or email us the names of deceased members of their family and friends and we will inscribe them in the memorial book and pray for them at every Mass in November.
- 3) In addition to Remembrance Day on November 11 when we honour those who gave their lives so that we have peace, we shall celebrate two Masses in November (Wednesday, November 18 and 25) for the faithful departed whose names are inscribed in the book of life, especially for those who died of the coronavirus.
- 4) We are grateful for the volunteers who exercise their discipleship during this critical time who assist us so that we can ensure the safety and security of our parishioners. Please wear a personal mask/face cover to protect yourself and others and have available sanitizers. We are in need of more volunteers to relieve and divide responsibilities. If you are in a position to help, please connect with me or the parish office. Thank you!
- 5) Please make an effort to be punctual for Mass as a courtesy to the hospitality ministers so they can participate at Mass without being constantly interrupted bringing you to your seat, do sanitizing and contact tracing. Late comers will have to wait inside the main entrance until the liturgical action, sanitizing and contact tracing is finished, before being seated.
- 6) Archbishop Prendergast has announced that he will retire before the end of the year. He will be succeeded by Archbishop Marcel Damphousse, currently co-adjustor bishop.
