<u>JOYFUL NEWS - MASSES HAVE RESUMED!</u> Our Mass times in July are: Monday-Friday 9am, Saturday 4:30pm, Sunday 8:30am, 10am, 11:30am.

Welcome back! We know these are a lot of changes to process. Don't worry – we will have volunteers to guide you along the way.

We have missed you and are looking forward to being able to worship together in person or watch the live streamed mass at 4:30pm on Saturday or at 10:00am on Sunday whenever possible. Those who are not ready to return to church Mass and have a computer, cell phone or other electronic devices can benefit from it. Please connect via the parish website – www.fatimaparish.ca With your help we can do so safely.

We encourage everyone to adhere to the Ottawa Public Health guidelines - if you are 65 and older, have a chronic condition or have a compromised immune system you may be at higher risk of developing complications. Please remember that **Sunday obligation is suspended until further notice** so it is not mandatory that you return to Mass at this time. Please stay safe. You might prefer attending a weekday Mass where it is less crowded. Or watch the Mass livestreamed at 11:30am on Sunday. **Things will be different.** You will notice many changes when you return. **We want to keep each other safe.** Here are some of the changes you can expect:

- You will be asked to <u>please stay home</u> if you exhibit any of the symptoms of flu or COVID19 including fever, sore throat, coughing, sneezing.
- You must wear a mask or face covering when you attend and you are asked to please bring your own sanitizer as well, if possible. Otherwise sanitizer will be available at the entrance & exit doors.

You do not need to register for Mass. We do not want to turn anyone away but we are limited to 100 people – please be patient as we move forward. We are complying with directives from the Archdiocese and health regulations. Unfortunately the washroom is only available for emergencies as it needs to be sanitized after each use. Our volunteer ushers will direct you to your seat. Please follow their instructions and do not move from your assigned spot. For a more detailed description of what to expect please check the latest Update for Parishioners found on our website.

BYRON AVENUE CONSTRUCTION: In advance of LRT tunnel construction you will notice work being done on Byron Avenue over the next few months as crews relocate utilities and do roadwork. The City of Ottawa advises: "The public can expect to see parking signage and temporary fencing around the work sites; fencing and signage will be relocated as work areas shift. Construction in this corridor will be ongoing and temporary minor delays to traffic may occur at times. Pedestrians and cyclists should use extra caution as traffic patterns change. Motorists should be aware of and adhere to traffic control signage, posted speed limits and traffic control personnel." At times the entrance to our parking lot might be blocked from Byron Avenue. Access will still be available via Woodroffe Avenue or Knightsbridge Road. Thank you for your patience.

CANADA 54 NOVENA FROM AUGUST 15 TO OCTOBER 7 to Our Lady of the Cape, Queen of Intercessors. This is a powerful opportunity to intercede from your own home by praying the Rosary for the conversion of souls, and Canada's needs related to the pandemic and to stopping Bill C-7 (medical assistance in dying (MAiD). 1) Reflection on the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Where is God in the midst of the pandemic? The Word reminds



us that God is present in the still breeze, and as well in the

storm of life. Jesus calms the fear of the disciples so they can place their trust upon him.

- 2) Reflection on the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Maintain justice, do what is right, salvation and deliverance belong to all, there are no foreigners beyond the reach of God! Jesus heals the Canaanite woman, set her faith as an example for all disciples to follow!
- 3) The Province has made it mandatory to wear a mask/face covering so as to reduce transmission of COVID19. The policy is to ensure that we shall not have a second wave which could set us back. We have also entered stage 3 where most businesses have cautiously re-opened, but with social-distancing. We are grateful for volunteers who exercise their discipleship during this critical time to assist us so that we can ensure the safety and security of our parishioners. Please check your body temperature before leaving home. Please wear a personal mask/face cover to protect yourselves and others and make use of the hand sanitizers.
- 4) During the pandemic the provincial regulation and diocesan guidelines are that we should suspend communion in the tongue until the pandemic is over and it is safe to do so. Please be respectful of the concern for safety during this time!
- 5) For the month of August at least, we shall not have servers, nor choir/music during Mass. Should the situation improve, we shall carefully open up gradually to ensure there is no second wave of infection.
- 6) We will keep the regular weekend Mass schedule in order to ensure not too many will be turned away. We shall help you fill your containers with holy water, and vigil lights can be lit before Masses only. Offerings for vigil lights can be placed in the tube near the statue of Our Lady of Fatima.
- 7) Please do not linger in church after Mass, as we need time to sanitize the church. Entrance will be at the main door and exit will be near the ramp door by St. Joseph's statue.
- 8) During the months of July and August the bulletins will be available every two weeks. If necessary, we shall send you an email message to update you on evolving situations.
- 9) We are thankful that weekend worship is possible, but things are not yet back to normal. At this time we shall keep the regular confession and Mass schedule (Monday-Friday morning Masses only). Anything beyond will have to wait until we have some normalcy.
