This week is a good time for us to reflect on our journey as people who live in the light of Christ. Do we recognize the presence of God, who walks with us from day to day? Do we recognize our community as the body of Christ and the temple of the Holy Spirit? Do we recognize our common destiny, which is to live in God forever?
