Lent begins on February 17, 2021 with the summons to "turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" as ashes are marked upon our head to remind us of our need for conversion. It is a season which calls us to listen more attentively to the Gospel and let it challenge us to renew our baptism, to allow God's grace to transform our lives. May this journey through the Season of Lent, through the Triduum to Easter and Pentecost be a time of "Spirit-filled" encounter with the Paschal Mystery, the death and resurrection of Christ for each of us and for our parish community.

We also make available at the table by the Main Entrance a limited quantity of free reading material for use during Lent. We invite you to pick up a copy for personal prayer and reflection.

Please note that as of February 16, 2021 our church is open at 8:30 am until the end of 9:00 am Mass on weekdays, from 4:00 pm until the end of 4:30 pm Mass on Saturday and from 8:00 am till after the 11:30 am Mass on Sundays. You are most welcome to spend time there especially during Lent for quiet time and meditation.

Here are some questions to ponder as we move through Lent:

- Are we aware that our Lenten journey prepares us to renew our baptismal promises?
- Are our own personal doors open to allow Christ to change our hearts?
- Will it be a time for us to allow our merciful God to lead us to reconciliation with those we have excluded or hurt, to heal what is broken, and to affirm what is good and upright?
- Will we embrace the disciplines of Lent: fasting, prayer, almsgiving and doing acts of charity as a reminder of God's love for everyone?
